MESSAGE FROM MAYOR NICK KAPPATOS

To the Residents of Runnemede,

I hope everyone is having a great year so far. In our continuing effort to keep you accurately informed about your town, we are providing every household and business with this Newsletter. I want to thank Council President Patty Passio and Councilman John Ranieri for all the time they put in to making this newsletter a reality.

This year, we are focusing on infrastructure improvements and making our community more attractive to businesses. All over our town you will see contractors repairing and replacing our sanitary sewer lines that are in the most need of attention. Another project is the completion of the road resurfacing on Washington and S. Oakland Avenues and the installation of sidewalks on Davis Road. We have begun the process of creating a redevelopment zone along the Black Horse Pike to deal with the empty buildings and a more vibrant business environment. Where there were two empty buildings, we will be welcoming two new businesses to the Pike, Cooper Urgent Care and Caliber Collision. This is a good sign of things to come.

In an effort to make our municipal building ADA compliant, you will have a new handicap accessible entrance from our new public parking lot to the front office. A LED sign will be installed to help with community messages and Borough announcements.

We will continue to improve our recreation facilities this year by removing hazardous trees around the Girls Softball Fields and install an irrigational well for new sprinklers that are being donated by The Sprinkler Company.

We want to thank the Camden County Freeholders. With their help, Runnemede received over \$183,000 this year alone to cover the cost of improvements. I also want to thank the Runnemede-Bellmawr-Glendora Rotary Club for their donation of the Bud Palmieri Pavilion at Beaver Branch Park. Thank-you, to all the members of Council and all our employees, for working so hard this past year. Without all of you working together we would not have accomplished so much.

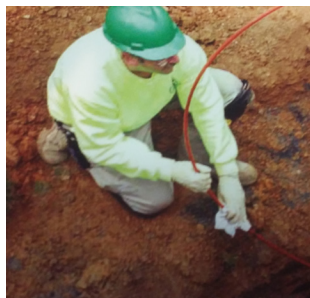

Left: Camera showing sewer lines before and after new slip lining. Notice the difference between the left and right images.



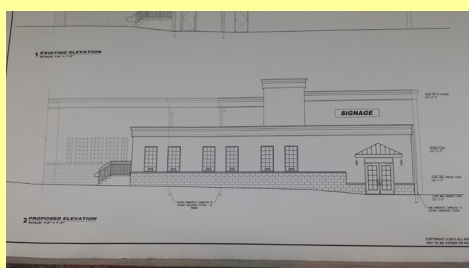

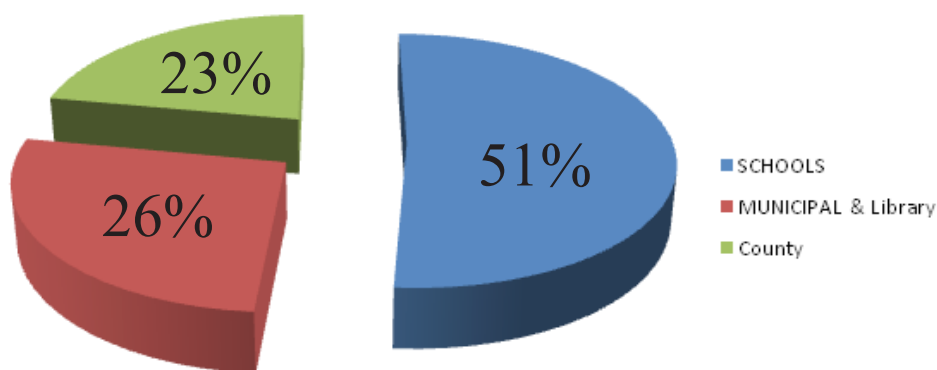

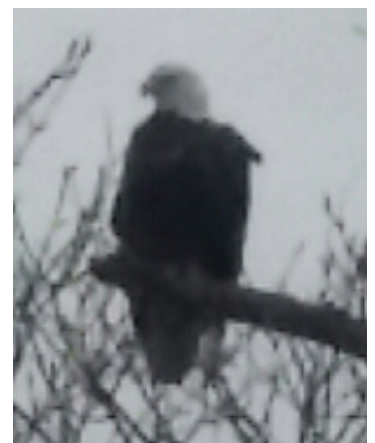

Pour baking soda down the drain and follow with vinegar. Cover and let sit for at least 30 minutes. Flush with boiling water.


Tip: Prevent your shower from clogging by using a drain trap to catch hairs.

CAMDEN COUNTY TOOL LIBRARY




Another important part of going green is to shop locally, especially when it comes to food. We're all so used to being able to run by the grocery store for anything we need that we don't stop to think about where that food comes from. But industrial farming is actually extremely damaging to the environment – it pollutes surrounding areas with toxic chemicals and uses vast amounts of resources, not just for producing food but also to get those foods from the farm to your table. When you shop at farmers' markets and grocery stores that carry local, organic fruits, vegetables, and meat you're helping the environment and ensuring you get nutritious, healthy meals. And the importance of thinking locally doesn't just apply to food either. When you buy locally-made green products like furniture or toys you're putting money back into your community and helping homegrown companies with environmentally friendly practices.



Weed-Be-Gone

- 1 Gallon Vinegar
- 2 Cups Epson Salt
- 1/4 Cup Dawn Dish Soap (The Blue Original)

It will kill anything you spray it on. Just mix and spray in the morning, after the dew has evaporated. Walk away. Go back after dinner and the weeds are all gone!

Cheaper than anything you can buy anywhere! Never buy Round-up again!

Going green also means thinking not just about global issues but also about local environmental problems. Volunteer with parks or natural centers to ensure your community has clean, well-maintained green spaces and get involved in local efforts to start or expand recycling programs and other sustainability efforts. The best way to make an impact is to start right in your own backyard.

YARD WASTE PICK-UP

Yard waste will be picked up every Monday until the last Monday in October. If Monday is a holiday, yard waste will be picked up the next day. Leaves must be placed in brown paper bags or you can put leaves in a can..NO PLASTIC BAGS now through October. Branches must be tied and bundled. Residents are requested to place debris in no more than 4' foot lengths at the curb. Residents may call Borough Hall Ext. 1004 to leave address if a chipper is needed.

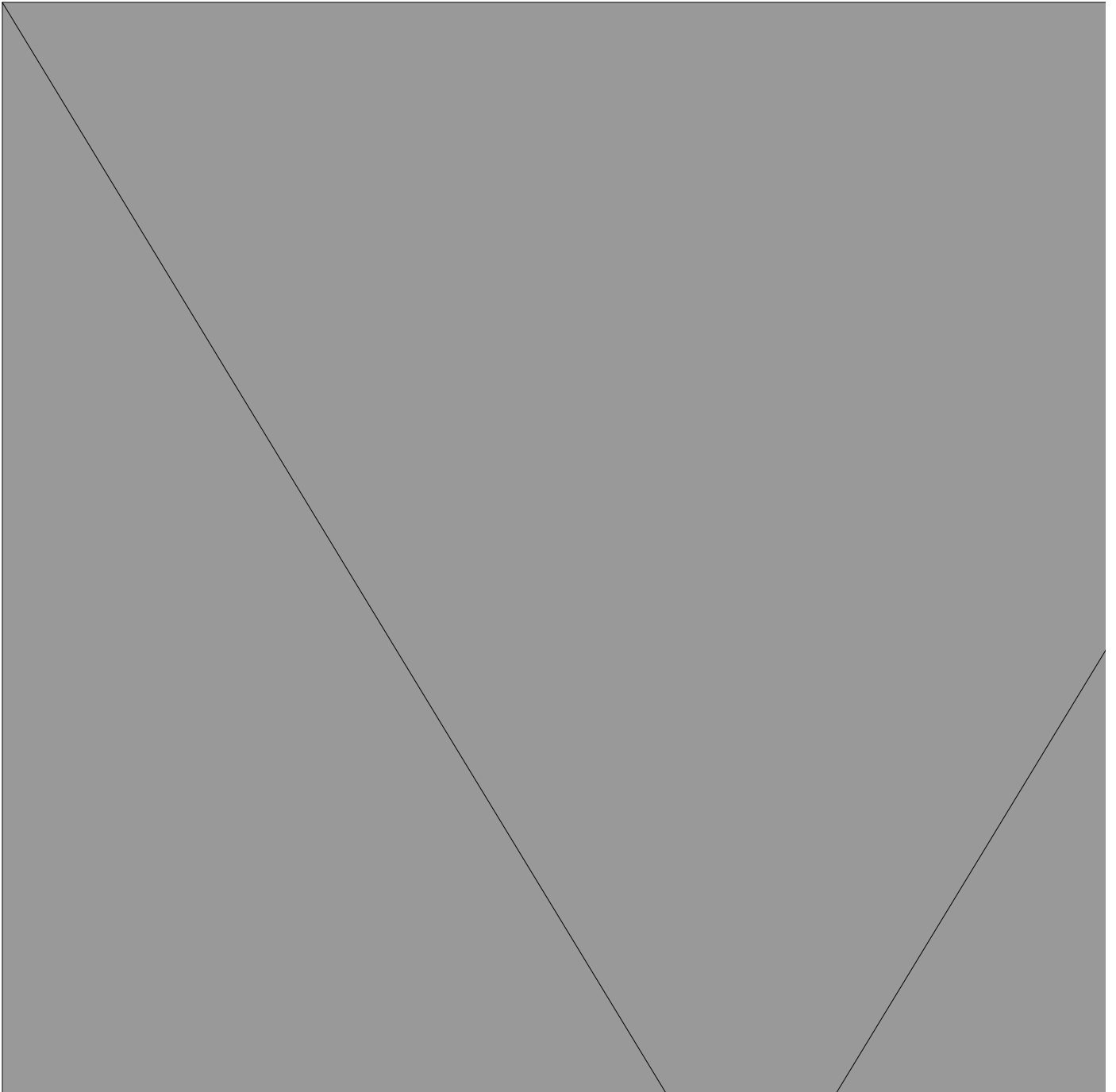

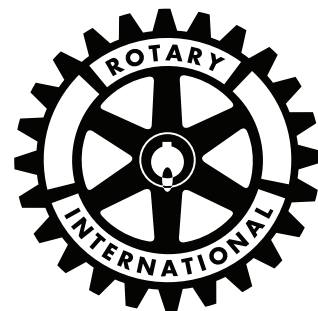
