The Caucus Meeting of Mayor and Council of the Borough of Runnemede was held on the above date remotely as well as in the meeting room of the Borough Hall, 24 N. Black Horse Pike, Runnemede, NJ. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 P.M. The following members were present at roll call: Council members: Laubenstein, Farrell, Passio, Kelly & Ranieri. Absent: Cepero; Present: Borough Engineer: Mark Basehore; Solicitor Daniel Long, and Shelley Streahle, CFO.

STATEMENT: Mayor Kappatos read the notice of this meeting pursuant to the "Open Public Meetings Act."

A discussion ensued as to items scheduled to appear on the July 5, 2022 agenda as follows:

Public Hearing Ordinance #22-09 & #22-10; Chapter 159 resolution for Clean Communities grant funds; amended cannabis resolution; 2% increase for non-contractuals; A discussion ensued regarding changes in the sewer department.

Councilman Cepero arrive at 6:17 PM.

PAYMENT OF BILLS: A motion was made by Passio, seconded by Kelly the list of bills as submitted by the clerk be approved for payment along with the monthly contractual bills when they become due. The motion carried and Mayor Kappatos requested a roll call vote with the following results: Ayes: Cepero, Farrell, Kelly, Passio, Ranieri & Laubenstein; Nays: None; Absent: None; Mayor Kappatos declared the bill list approved.

Councilwoman Passio reported on the line-up of the parades on Independence Day. Patty also reported on the fireworks in Barrington on July 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Councilwoman Kelly stated she would give her report at the regular meeting.

Councilman Ranieri reported on the Bans Sale and the auditors.

Councilman Cepero stated he would wait until the council meeting to present his report.

Councilman Farrell also wished to wait until the meeting for his report.

Councilman Laubenstein also wished to wait until the council meeting to give his report.

Public Works Superintendent Harry Wozunk had several items to discuss:

Mr. Wozunk informed all that Bellmawr/Mt. Ephraim would no longer be collecting trash in larger than 32 gallon cans. Men are unable to lift the cans so when able to they pull bags from can. One worker was cut this way so this will stop. A discussion ensued about the best way to notify residents that these cans are unacceptable. Bellmawr/Mt. Ephraim workers will be placing stickers on the cans informing residents they will no longer pick up trash in these cans. Runnemede will have to notify all about the new rule.

Harry informed Mayor & Council that two of our generators are no longer working. A discussion ensued as to how to remedy the situation. There is a large problem at the Forrest Avenue pump station and several scenarios as to how to remedy this issue were discussed. Mayor & Council are looking for most cost effective way to handle the broken pump.

Councilman Farrell asked when the chicken ordinance would be ready. Dan Long said he was working on it.

Police Chief Sampolski talked about the carnival, Junior Police Academy and code enforcement.

Borough Engineer Mark Basehore reported that he thought the cost for redoing the pump station at Forrest Avenue would be around \$500,000. Mark also reported on the bid opening on Friday for Manor Court, Bowers Avenue &n Forrest Avenue. Mr. Basehore also reported on the open space application and informed everyone that even though an application was filed by both the Borough and the VFW, only one would be considered. Mark also reported on the project by SJ Gas Company near Bowers Avenue. The proposed bridges for the park were discussed and Mr. Basehore said he never received the information requested to move forward with the project.

Council President Passio expressed her concerns about an event that occurred near the lake over the weekend. Ms. Passio stated there was trash left all over, tents erected, port-a-potty still there, mounds

were built and no one knew much about the event. Patty raised questions about the affect on the wildlife and possible polluting of the lake. Patty also asked were they cooking there, was fire marshal aware, was insurance obtained.

A discussion ensued about how this should be handled. Consensus was that insurance must be obtained, we would not pay for port-a-potty, fire marshal to be contacted for cooking and tents, remove own trash and no alcohol.

## GOOD & WELFARE:

This portion of the meeting was open to the public:

Ken Leap, 12 Washington Avenue: Mr. Leap read a letter objecting the mural/public art ordinance which is scheduled for adoption on July 5<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Leap spoke about running legal issues by Councilwoman Kelly. Borough Solicitor Long interrupted saying Mrs. Kelly cannot give legal advice as she is not an attorney. Mr. Long said that giving her a title of "legal advisor" was totally inappropriate. Mr. Leap also stated that two members of council are members of their group but failed to tell you about the mural. Mayor Kappatos explained that there are six members of council who are responsible for decision making. Mayor Kappatos wanted to know what the objections were to the ordinance and no answer was given. Councilman Farrell expressed his feelings that he thinks Mayor & Council should have some say as to what is placed on buildings in town. Mr. Leap stated that the businesses object to the ordinance and again Mayor Kappatos asked what is it that they object to. No answer was given. Solicitor Long explained the process of how an ordinance is introduced, adopted and amended. Mr. Leap asked for input from a Mr. Vasquez to assist with changing the ordinance. Mr. Long said we would agree to this if your group promises no more murals until ordinance is adopted. No one from the art group agreed to that.

David Steinberg, 825 E. Clements Bridge Road: Mr. Steinberg stated that it seems there is a lack of communication.

Russell Burt, 51 Hilltop Avenue, Gloucester Township: Mr. Burt stated he thought regulation of the arts is unnecessary. Mr. Burt also had questions about the exercise equipment which the Rotary purchased for Venella Park. Mr. Burt said he would get the design to Mr. Basehore.

Rachelle Omenson, 21 Singley Avenue: Ms. Omenson spoke about obtaining points for the sustainable report. Ms. Omenson criticized the borough website because there are things that should be on it that were not. Ms. Omenson proceeded to say that she had sent things to the Clerk but they were not on the site. Mayor Kappatos asked her to name what she sent to the Clerk that did not appear on website, she did not reply. Mayor Kappatos explained that anything you would like to be placed on the website can be sent to the Clerk who would forward it to our website administrator. Ms. Omenson stated she tried to contact our website administrator but received no reply. Borough Clerk Joyce Pinto informed Ms Omenson that our website administrator would not respond to anyone other than the person authorized to place items on website.

Steve Singiser, 456 Center Avenue: Mr Singiser spoke about trash cans, traffic lights and chickens.

Heather Farrell, 314 Sheppard Avenue: Ms. Farrell talked about chickens already in town.

Seeing no one else wishing to speak, a motion was made by Kelly, seconded by Laubenstein to close the good and welfare portion of the meeting. The motion carried and Mayor Kappatos declare the good and welfare portion closed.

There being no further business to come before Mayor and Council at this time a motion was made by Passio and seconded by Laubenstein to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried and Mayor Kappatos declared the meeting adjourned at 8:50 PM.
