WHEREAS, HoneyLeaf NJ has submitted a proposal to legally sell cannabis products at the retail level at a facility located at 413 N. Black Horse Pike, Runnemede, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, a proposal has been submitted by Greenhouse Garden LLC to change the name of the approval from HoneyLeaf NJ to Greenhouse Garden LLC; and

WHEREAS, the proposal complies with all provisions of Ordinance #21-13; and

WHEREAS, cannabis establishments must be licensed by the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission requires applicants for licensure to provide proof of local support, which shall be demonstrated by a Resolution adopted by the municipality's governing body; and

WHEREAS, Mayor and Council of the Borough of Runnemede desires to support Greenhouse Garden LLC NJ's application to the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission; and

WHEREAS, this application will be considered submitted "fourth in time".

ORDINANCE #22-10

AN ORDINANCE CREATING CHAPTER 396, ENTILTED "MURALS AND PUBLIC ART" OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF RUNNEMEDE

WHEREAS, in their continuing efforts to strengthen and enhance the Borough of Runnemede (the "Borough"), the Mayor and Borough Council have noted that public art can provide an enhancement to the community and quality of neighborhoods within the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council have therefore determined that an Ordinance governing the creation of public art within the Borough is in the best interests of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Borough.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Runnemede, County of Camden, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION I. Chapter 396 of the Code of the Borough of Runnemede, entitled "Murals and Public Art", shall be created to read as follows:

Sec. 396-1 Findings and Purpose.

The Mayor and Borough Council, in their continuing efforts to strengthen and enhance the business community in the Borough, have noted that murals can provide an enhancement to the community and the quality of neighborhoods within the Borough, provided that they do not cause distraction to motor vehicle operators and are consistent with the character of the neighborhood.

Sec. 396-2 Definitions.

As used in this section:

"Mural" shall mean a painting or illustration applied directly to a wall of an independent structure within the Borough but shall not include: (a) any such painting or illustration requiring a separate foundation or footing; (b) any depiction or contents of a commercial, trademarked, copyrighted, or other licensed feature; (c) any message or advertisement for any individual, group, or entity (whether or not commercial); or (d) any subjects or material of a scandalous, libelous, or indecent nature as determined by contemporary community standards.

"Public art" shall mean publicly accessible, original art installation that enriches the Borough and evokes meaning. It may include permanent visual art, performances, installations, events and other temporary works, preservation or restoration of unique architectural features, ornamentation or details. It may also include the artist-designed infrastructure and structures themselves. Public art should consider the site, its context and audience. Public art may possess functional as well as aesthetic qualities; it may be integrated into the site or be a discrete work.

"Streetscape" shall mean the overall arrangement and interaction of signs, lighting, statuary, fountains, facade treatments (including murals), landscaping, walkways, window treatments, and the like in view, primarily, of pedestrians and motorists upon public or semi-public rights-of-way.

Sec. 396-3 Permit Requirement.

Any public art or mural to be erected, painted, or otherwise installed within the Borough, shall not be erected, painted or installed without first obtaining approval from the Borough Council and a permit from the Borough Clerk for the same.

Sec. 396-4 Application and Fee for Public Art or Mural Permit.

Application for a permit to erect, paint and/or install public art or a mural within the Borough shall be made on a form provided by the Borough Clerk, or if no such form has been prepared, by a letter, signed by the property owner and the applicant, and filed with the Borough Clerk containing or enclosing the following information:

- (1) The owner of the property where the installation is to be made.
- (2) The street address and tax lot and block number of the property in question.
- (3) A description of the subject matter of the mural or other feature, if appropriate.
- (4) Sketch(es) or rendering(s) showing the appearance of the mural or other installation.
- (5) A precise description and visual rendering of the location and size of the public art or mural.
- (6) A general description of the color scheme of the installation.
- (7) A general description of the points from which the installation may be viewed, with attention to its visibility to motorists and its proximity to intersections.

- (8) An application fee in the amount of \$50.00.
- (9) Such other information as the Borough Council may reasonably request.

Sec. 396-5 Review of Public Art or Mural Applications.

Upon the filing of an application, the Borough Clerk shall cause the application to be forwarded to the Borough Council for review and consideration. Upon receipt of the public art or mural application, the Borough Council shall schedule a hearing for the purpose of reviewing said application. The Borough Council shall advise the applicant, in writing, at least fourteen (14) days prior to the hearing, of the date, time and place of said hearing, and shall ensure that a notice of the hearing is placed in the official newspaper of the Borough at least seven (7), but not more than fourteen (14), days prior to the hearing.

At the meeting, the Borough Council shall allow the applicant to be heard, as well as any other interested parties who wish to address the proposed application. The Borough Council shall consider the application in light of the proposed installation's compatibility with the neighborhood in which it is to be located, its size in relation to surrounding features, whether it is likely to cause a distraction or hazard to pedestrian or vehicular traffic, its compliance with the definitional provisions of this Section, its compliance with the design guidelines adopted by the Council, and its overall aesthetic impact on the neighborhood. The Council shall also consider the significance of the proposed project's location, the artist's ability to complete the project in a timely manner, and the ability and willingness of the property owner to maintain the installation. The Council may reject any application that is deemed not in the best interests of the community by not enhancing the residents' quality of life and the Borough's commitment to a clean, safe, healthy, and diverse community.

In considering the application, the Council may, in its discretion, seek the opinions of professionals familiar with the subject or field involved, including but not limited to historians, artists, sculptors or similar professionals.

Sec. 396-6 Requirements for Murals.

The following requirements shall apply to mural construction within the Borough which shall be duly considered by the Council during the review process:

- (1) No more than two (2) square feet of the mural may contain the name of the artist, sponsor and/or product likeness.
- (2) Murals may not be mere extensions or enlargements of an existing sign.
- (3) Murals shall become the property of the property owner following construction.

Sec. 396-7 Issuance of Permit; Conditions; Expiration.

Final action on the application shall be made by way of a vote of the Borough Council to issue or deny the permit for the proposed installation, which shall be rendered within thirty (30) days of the submission of a complete application, unless this time frame is extended by consent of the applicant. An approval may be subject to any reasonable conditions deemed appropriate by the Commission.

Upon positive action by the Council, the Borough Clerk shall promptly issue the permit, with a notation as to any required conditions imposed. Permits shall expire one hundred eighty (180) days after the date of issuance. Any approved project not installed within the one hundred eighty (180) day time-frame shall be required to re-apply and obtain a new permit.

Sec. 396-8 Maintenance.

Maintenance of the public art or mural shall be the responsibility of the property owner on whose premises the installation is located. However, business owners, artists, sponsors, and other interested parties may reach private arrangements regarding maintenance.

All installations shall be maintained by the owner in good condition free from chips, stains, graffiti, defacing, fading paint, and the like. Failure to properly maintain an installation shall subject the property owner to the penalties of this Section.

Sec. 396-9 Enforcement; Violations and Penalties.

Violations of the provisions of this Section shall subject the owner and/or violator to a fine as specified in Section 281-10 of the Borough Code (relating to Exterior Property Maintenance Code violations). Each day that such a violation continues shall be considered a separate offense.

Sec. 396-10 Applicability of Construction and Land Use Regulations.

Nothing in this Section shall be interpreted as a waiver, replacement, or substitute for any installation that requires a Construction Code or Land Use Approval under applicable provisions of any statute, ordinance, rule or regulation.

SECTION III. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with any part of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are in conflict or inconsistent.

SECTION IV. If any section, provision, or part of provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be unenforceable or invalid by any court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance, or any part thereof, other than the part so held unenforceable or invalid.

SECTION V. This Ordinance shall take effect after passage and publication in the manner provided by law.

ORDINANCE #22-11

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF RUNNEMEDE, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE BOROUGH CODE AT CHAPTER 106, ENTITLED "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," TO INCLUDE NEW ARTICLE XVII, ENTITLED "DO NOT BLOCK THE BOX", AS WELL AS AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING ARTICLE VII, ENTITLED "SCHEDULES," TO INCLUDE NEW SECTION 106-21.2, ENTITLED "SCHEDULE IX: DO NOT BLOCK THE BOX INTERSECTIONS"

WHEREAS, N.J.SA. 39:4-8 and N.J.S.A. 39:4-197(1)(d) and (e) empowers the Borough of Runnemede ("Borough") to take regulatory action to govern traffic within the Borough; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-67, motorists are prohibited from obstructing traffic at intersections; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that traffic at the intersection of Black Horse Pike (N.J.S.H. Route 168) and Constitution Road has been intensified by the blockage of said intersection and has resulted in safety concerns, as well as restricting the expedition of traffic along the public highways; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that to prevent the blockage at the intersection of Black Horse Pike (N.J.S.H. Route 168) and Constitution Road, it is necessary to stripe the intersection to indicate a "box," to install signage instructing motorists not to block the "box," and to amend the Borough Code to permit enforcement of such measures.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Runnemede, in the County of Camden, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Amendment(s). The Borough of Runnemede Code at Chapter 106, entitled "Vehicles and Traffic," is hereby amended and supplemented to include new Article XVII, to be entitled "Do Not Block the Box," which shall read as follows:

Article XVII Do Not Block the Box

§ 106-53 Do Not Block the Box Intersections

No driver shall enter a marked crosswalk or a marked intersection described in Scheduled IX (or § 106-21.2), unless there is sufficient space on the other side of the intersection to accommodate the vehicle without obstructing the passage of other vehicles or pedestrians.

The Borough of Runnemede Code at Chapter 106, entitled "Vehicles and Traffic," is hereby further amended and supplemented to include new Section 106-21.2, to be entitled "Schedule IX: Do Not Block the Box Intersections," which shall read as follows:

§ 106-21.2 Schedule IX: Do Not Block the Box Intersections

In accordance with the provisions of § 106-53, the following intersections are designated as do not block the box intersections:

Intersection

Black Horse Pike (N.J.S.H. Route 168) and Constitution Road

SECTION 2. Repealer. Any and all other ordinances inconsistent with any of the terms and provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

SECTION 3. Severability. In the event that any section paragraph, clause phrase, term, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, such judgment shall not effect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the section, paragraph, clause, term, provision or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in such judgment shall be rendered.

SECTION 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE #22-12

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF RUNNEMEDE, COUNTY OF CAMDEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF RUNNEMEDE

WHEREAS, the Borough of Runnemede is a municipal entity organized and existing under the laws of the State of New Jersey and located in Camden County; and

WHEREAS, the keeping of backyard chickens, hens and other fowl and livestock is currently prohibited by the Borough Code; and

WHEREAS, State of New Jersey encourages municipalities to promote sustainable programs; and

WHEREAS, the keeping of "Backyard Chicken Hens" is a means by which sustainability can be achieved; and

WHEREAS, in light of the above, the Governing Body of the Borough of Runnemede deems it in the best interests of the taxpayers and residents of the Borough of Runnemede to amend the Code to authorize a pilot program which permits the keeping of "Backyard Chicken Hens" under certain circumstances; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to NJSA 40:48-2, the Governing Body is authorized to enact and amend ordinances as deemed necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and as may be necessary to carry into effect the powers and duties conferred and imposed upon the Borough of Runnemede by law; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Runnemede, County of Camden and State of New Jersey, as follows:

Chapter 413 of the Borough Code, entitled "Livestock" is hereby amended, supplemented and revised to read in its entirety as follows:

Article I- General Provisions

413-1 Definitions.

Backyard Chicken Hens - Chicken Hens kept and maintained as set forth in this chapter

413-2 Keeping, stabling or breeding prohibited; exceptions.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to keep, stable, breed or quarter any livestock or fowl as defined the Borough Code of the Borough of Runnemede within the Borough limits of the Borough of Runnemede. This prohibition shall not apply to any of the following:

- A. The keeping of cats, dogs or other domestic animals within the limits of the Borough of Runnemede.
- B. The keeping of Backyard Chicken Hens as provided for in this Chapter.

Article II - Backyard Chicken Pilot Program

413-3 Chickens Permitted; Pilot Program.

A pilot program for the keeping of backyard chicken hens is hereby authorized. Keeping of backyard chicken hens shall be permitted in the Borough of Runnemede subject to the rules and regulations as specified in this Article. The pilot program shall commence on October 1, 2022 and terminate on December 31, 2023 at 12:01 am, unless the Borough of Runnemede acts to continue same prior to that date. In the event the Borough of Runnemede does not act to continue the program prior to said termination date, all persons with backyard chicken hens shall be allowed to retain those Permitted Chicken

Hens on the property as of December 31, 2023 in accordance with the requirements of this Article until such Hens have expired or been removed by the Owner. No such Hens may be replaced.

- 413-4 Participation; Location; number restricted.
- A. The following shall be eligible to participate in the pilot program: residents of single family homes or residents of "twin" homes or "row" homes which meet the criteria set forth in this Section.
- B. For purposes of this pilot program, no more than twenty (20) licenses may be issued at any one time. Any additional households wanting to participate may be considered on an individual basis by the Chicken Advisory Board established pursuant to this Chapter in conjunction with the liaison to the Governing Body.
- C. There shall be a limit of two (2) chickens permitted per 1,000 square feet of lot capped at a maximum of nine (9) chickens; no roosters permitted.
- D. The coop and enclosed run shall be kept at least fifteen (15) feet from the habitable portion of the neighboring residential dwelling. The minimum five (5) foot side and rear yard setback shall be maintained as a buffer with maintained lawn or landscape vegetation. Run-off waste on adjacent properties shall not be permitted. Garages, attached or otherwise, and accessory buildings shall not be considered a "residential dwelling" for purposes of calculating the required distance. Chickens may roam outside of the coop area in the back yard suitably fenced to keep them contained provided that a resident age eighteen (18) or older is present the entire time.
- E. The keeping of chickens shall be limited to the rear yard as defined by this Ordinance.
- 413-5 License required; fee; expiration; class.
- A. No person shall keep chickens on their property without first obtaining a license from the municipal clerk's office and paying the required fee therefor. No license shall be issued unless the applicant therefore has demonstrated compliance with all criteria set forth in this Article VI. No licensed shall be issued prior to any applicant meeting with the Chicken Advisory Board to determine if the applicant is able to meet all criteria. Every license issued pursuant to this Article shall expire annually on March 1 after the Pilot begins. Any applicant who currently has backyard chicken hens within the Borough of Runnemede, shall have priority over any one else for the purpose of applying for a license. The Chicken Advisory Board may grant a waiver of lot size and/or maximum permitted chickens to those persons maintaining chickens at the time of the passage of the within Ordinance to allow such person(s) to come into compliance with this Ordinance through the natural expiration of their chickens provided such waiver does not negatively affect the health, safety and welfare of any resident or person and application for such waiver is made within thirty (30) days of the passage of this Ordinance.
- B. A license fee of \$10.00 shall be paid for each license issued pursuant to this Article.
- C. Each applicant wishing to participate in the pilot program or desiring to keep backyard chickens thereafter in the event the pilot program is not terminated, shall be required to take a class on the basics of raising backyard chickens. Proof of attendance must be presented with the completed application. The Borough will provide a class minimally once a year at a nominal fee for anyone who has not previously met this requirement. The handling of this class will be the responsibility of the Chicken Advisory Board. A member of the Chicken Advisory Board will review the application with the applicant prior to final submission.
- D. Tenants of property submitting an application must have the consent of the landlord.
- 413-6 Requirements for coops; slaughter of chickens; waste.

The following regulations and conditions for the keeping and housing of chickens shall be complied with:

- A. The coop shall be the appropriate size for the number of chickens and shall consist of a minimum of three (3) square feet per chicken.
- B. The coop shall be dry and well ventilated with windows to admit sunlight and shall not be heated.
- C. The housing of chickens must be the primary purpose of the structure.
- D. The coop must be kept clean and the utilization of a tarp as a portion of the roof is not permitted.
- E. Clean water must be provided, and food must be kept in a tightly sealed rodent and predator-proof container.
- F. The yard in the area where the coop is located shall be clean, free from odors and dust abatement techniques must be utilized.
- G. There shall be no slaughter of chickens in the Borough of Runnemede.
- H. Waste shall be handled properly to prevent offensive odors or disposed in an environmentally-friendly manner.
- I. The coop must meet all of the size limitations of an accessory building as may be otherwise provided for in the Code of the Borough of Runnemede.

413-7 Creation of "Chicken Advisory Board"; complaints.

- A. A Chicken Advisory Board consisting of at least five (5) members of the community shall be formed. The Mayor shall appoint all members and designate the Chair, all of whom shall serve for a one (1) year term. The members shall elect a Vice Chair and Board Secretary from the remaining members who shall also serve for a one (1) year term. All terms are on a calendar year basis. The Board shall meet on regular basis and keep minutes which shall be submitted along with quarterly reports to the Governing Body via a Borough Council selected liaison to the Chicken Advisory Board. These reports will include any activities of the Board, we well as any complaints from residents concerning backyard chicken hens and the resolution, if any, of those complaints.
- B. When a complaint is received by the Borough of Runnemede, it will be forwarded to the Board for investigation by two members of the Board. If the Board finds a violation of this Article, a notice of violation will be issued by the Borough Code Enforcement Officer. If after thirty (30) days, the violation has not been remedied, the Borough Code Enforcement Office shall be notified, so that enforcement proceedings may be implemented. The Chicken Advisory Board will assist anyone desiring to no longer participate in the backyard chicken program to relocate their chickens.

Article III Enforcement

413-8 Access to property.

Any member of the local and/or county health department and/or Borough Code Official shall be permitted to enter any property for the purpose of a site inspection for the purpose of ensuring compliance with the provisions of Article VI, either during the application process or during the period of the license. Said individuals set forth herein shall give 24 hours' notice to the license holder.

413-9 Revocation of license.

Failure to comply with the conditions and regulations set forth in the Article shall result in revocation of the license after notice in writing and a hearing before the Code Official. Said hearing must occur within twenty (20) days of notice of revocation. The Code Official's revocation of a license may be appealed to the governing body within twenty (20) days of the revocation in writing filed with the Municipal Clerk setting forth the basis of the appeal.

413-10 Violations and penalties.

Any person who violates any provision of this Article shall, upon conviction in the Borough of Runnemede Municipal Court of any such other having jurisdiction, be sentenced to a fine not exceeding one thousand, two hundred and fifty dollars (\$1,250.00), or imprisonment for a term not exceeding ninety (90) days, or community service for a term not exceeding ninety (90) days, or all of the above. Each day that a

violation occurs shall be deemed a separate and distinct offense and subject to the penalty provisions of this Article.

SECTION 3. Except as set forth herein in Articles V, VI and VII the balance of Chapter 95 shall not be affected by this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. All Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith.

SECTION 5. If the provisions of any section, subsection, paragraphs, subdivisions, or clause of this Ordinance shall be judged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such order of judgment shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of any section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision, or clause of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication according to law.
